Overhauled Qube locomotive 8030 one of the units sold as part of purchase of South Spur Rail Services by POTA from Coote Industrial ran its light engine works trail with 1874 from Gemco Forrestfield to Toodyay West on October 26th. 8030 that had spent a number of years stored out of service at Chullora NSW following its sale to Silverton Rail by Pacific National that following Silverton takeover by SSRS came part of Allco leasing fleet eventually reverting to SSRS/Gemco ownership. 8030 was hauled to Parkes in early 2009 then hauled by SCT006 & SCT015 on 5PG1 delayed owing to Curtin derailment arriving overnight February 7th/8th 2009 it was shunted into Gemco for overhaul by ARG on 12th. Overhaul was nearing completion by September 26th with the locomotive out in Gemco yard having final adjustments made.

1874 hauled two further container flats from Forrestfield to SSRS/Gemco yard on October 26th prior to running works trial with 8030 to Toodyay West. These container flats have been taken off their bogies and are now on the ground as are their bogies.

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The forthcoming wheat season of 2010/2011 looks like one of the smallest for many years with the severe drought suffered in most of the South West of WA this year. The only areas with average or above crops are in Esperance, Ravensthorpe area in south east and Northampton in north. This crop will be about 5.5million tonnes against usual crop of in excess of 12 million tons. The effects of this poor harvest will spread through the communities and also will have profound effect on train operations on the wheat lines this year. One of these lines in the Mid West the Narngulu Perenjori line will commence to haul iron ore in 2011 so its traffic will increase substantially. While other lines especially the tier three lines will see their traffic virtually disappear as they have no other traffic.
